Three Card Poker Rules

- 1. Play Pair Plus Bet the Pair Plus spot to bet on your own hand. If your hand contains a pair or better, you win.
- 2. Play Ante Bet on the Ante spot to play against the Dealer's hand.
- 3. If you bet on the Ante spot and like your hand, you must place a wager on the Play spot that is equal to the Ante. It is your Three Card Poker hand against the Dealer's Three Card Poker hand. The best hand wins.
- 4. Ante Bonus If you make the Ante and Play wagers, you may win a bonus payout even if the Dealer doesn't qualify and even if the Dealer's hand beats your hand.
- 5. Ranking of Hands The ranking of hands in Three Card Poker differs from traditional poker hands. In Three Card Poker, a Straight beats a Flush. Hands are ranked from highest to lowest as follows:
 - a. Straight Flush (highest ranking hand) is a hand consisting of three (3) cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with Ace, King and Queen being the highest Straight Flush and 3, 2, and Ace being the lowest ranking Straight Flush.
 - b. Three-of-a-Kind is a hand consisting of three (3) cards of the same rank, regardless of suit, with three Aces being the highest ranking Three-of-a-Kind and three 2's being the lowest ranking Three-of-a-Kind.
 - c. Straight is a hand consisting of three (3) cards of consecutive rank, regardless of suit, with Ace, King and Queen being the highest ranking Straight and 3, 2, and Ace being the lowest ranking Straight.
 - d. Flush is a hand consisting of three (3) cards of the same suit, regardless of rank.
 - e. Pair (lowest ranking hand) is a hand consisting of two (2) cards of the same rank, regardless of suit, with two Aces being the highest ranking Pair and two 2's being the lowest ranking Pair.
- 6. If a hand does not contain a pair or better, the hand that contains the highest ranking card(s) wins. An Ace is high except in a 3-2-Ace sequence.
- 7. If the Dealer qualifies with Queen high or better, and your hand is ranked higher than the Dealer's hand, you are paid 1 to 1 on both the Ante Wager and the Play Wager.
- 8. If the Dealer does not hold a hand with a Queen high or better rank, your Ante Wager shall automatically be paid 1 to 1 and your Play Wager will push.
- 9. Pair Plus and Ante Bonus payouts will be posted at the table.
- 10. Minimum and maximum betting limits and payout odds will be posted at the table.
- 11. Side betting between and amongst players, with or against the house is prohibited.
